### *“Three to Thrive”*

~ Dr. Lee Roberson (1909-2007)

Every chance Dr. Lee Roberson got he told the men of his church **it takes “three to thrive”**. This became one of Pastor Roberson’s most famous sayings.

**“Three to thrive”** meant that every man should be in church three times a week: Sunday morning, Sunday evening, and Wednesday evening. The men of his church listened and practiced that advice. The church in Tennessee grew from nothing to 10,000 in attendance.

Pastor Roberson stressed that the men should set the example and bring their wives and children with them. It worked. The result was a strong church, strong marriages, and strong families.

**Let’s work that here and build a great church for God!**
