FRANCIS ASBURY, A GREAT SINGLE IN HISTORY

One day, while riding through Wilmington, NC, Francis Asbury passed a slave walking down the street. He said, "Good day, Sir," and the slave responded.

Asbury rode on, but was impressed by the Holy Spirit that he should witness to the man, so he turned back to find the slave.

"Sir, what is your name?" Asbury asked.

"I'm a slave. They all call me Punch, because I fight so much."

Then Asbury opened the Scripture and told Punch about Christ, about the power of God to save. After praying with him, he went on his way.

Twenty years later, Asbury was back in that community preaching. At the end of the service, a man approached and said, "Bishop, I'm Punch... You talked to me about Jesus, prayed with me. I went to my room, got down on my knees, confessed my sins, asked Him to forgive me, and my room was filled with an

incredible light. And, you know, I've never fought nor cursed or played cards since. And I've got 300 people out there who call me their pastor."

Pastor Kohl's Note: Francis Asbury (1745-1816) was the Father of Methodism in America, back when Methodists were Fundamentalists. He was an Evangelist who never married, never had a place to call home.

Yet he ordained 3,000 preachers, and Methodism grew from 13,790 to 214,235 in his 45 years of ministry! He presided over 224 annual conferences and preached 17,000 sermons. Traveled over 300,000 miles, including 6,000 on horseback each year. His funeral was attended by 25,000 people.

His journals reveal his zeal and wide missionary activity. When he left his native country of England he said, "Where am I going? To the New World. To gain honor or money? No, I am going to live to God and bring others to do so."

What an example for all single people today. Live for others. Live unto God. Live so as to have a big funeral someday!



Engraved on Francis Asbury's monument in Washington DC are these words:

"His continuous journey throught cities villages and settlements from 1771 to 1816 greatly promoted patriotism, education, morality, and religion in the American republic."

And "If you seek for the results of his labor, you will find them in our Christian civilization."
