SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE



Signer #16: Francis Lewis (1713-1802)

New York. Age at signing: 63

Married: Elizabeth (7 children)

Occupation: Merchant

Quotes & Notes:

In the fall of 1776, the British cavalry, galloped toward Lewis' fine country estate. Not finding Lewis at home "so he could get the hanging he deserved," the cavalry was extremely angry and took vengeance upon his property. They confiscated silver, clocks, clothing, china, food, and drink. Everything that could be carried away was stuffed into British saddlebags. Lewis' extensive library and valuable papers were piled up and burned.

With undue brutality, Mrs Lewis was made to watch her property destroyed, then taken prisoner and treated with unusual cruelty. She was carried off by horseback and, during captivity, was closely confined, given no bed to lie on, or even a change of clothes for several months. The aging woman slept on the floor of an unheated prison with only a slop bucket at her side.

Finally, General Washington arranged a prisoner exchange for her, but her health was irreparably damaged by the effects of imprisonments and she died soon afterward.
