SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE



Signer #19: Abraham Clark (1726-1794) New Jersey. Age at signing: 50 Married: Sarah (10 children) Occupation: Farmer, Lawyer

Ouotes & Notes:

When his son, Thomas, an artillery captain, was put in solitary confinement in a dark hole of the ship and was not fed, Abraham Clark was informed by the British that his son was held captive and would be released only if Clark deserted the American cause.

But patriotism was strong in this plain and pious Signer, and he rejected the enemy's offer to free his son . . .

Upon adjournment of Congress in June 1794, Mr. Clark retired from public life, being exhausted by political toils and infirmities of his feeble condition. In the autumn of 1794 he experienced a heat stroke while watching a bridge being built across one of his fields, Realizing his danger, he stepped into his chaise and drove himself home. Two hours later he died, at age 69.

He was buried in the church yard in Rahway, the same church to which he had given so generously. This inscription is on his grave:

Firm and decided as a patriot,
Zealous and faithful as a friend to the public
He loved his country,
And adhered to her cause
In the darkest hours of her struggles
Against oppression.
