The British were determined to make John Hart their prisoner. Neighbors warned John that the British were marching down the road to his house, but John was unwilling to leave his family. His wife was suffering from a debilitating disease which prevented her from being removed from her bed. His neighbors begged him to flee, promising to care for his wife while his 13 children fled. At the last moment, John fled to the woods and was hunted with a fierce perseverance. Scarcely able to elude his enemies, he was often in desperate need of food and necessities. He lived in the woods and the hills, sleeping in caves or out in the open in the frigid December weather, never sleeping in the same place two nights in a row. One night he concealed himself in the presence of a large dog who was his companion for a time and afforded him some warmth.

He never repented the course he had taken. He enlisted himself in a good cause; and in the darkest periods, still believed that a righteous Providence would ultimately triumph.

He was greatly beloved by his family and friends, and highly respected by a large circle of acquaintance, who often appealed to his wisdom and judgement in the settlement of their local affairs. In addition to this, he enjoyed the reputation of being a sincere and humble Christian. He was exceedingly liberal to the Baptist church of Hopewell, to which community he belonged; and greatly assisted them in the erection of a public house of worship; the ground for which he presented to the church, and also as the ground for a burial place. Such was the life, and such the last end, of "honest John Hart."
