In September, 1777, the British capture of Philadelphia brought further hardship to Clymer. His home was in Chester County, outside Philadelphia, right in the path of the British march. His family managed to escape, but British sympathizers pointed out his house to British troops, "and the British soldiers sacked the house, destroyed the furniture, and wasted every sort of property which they could find." They also surrounded the house of his aunt with intent to destroy it, but spared it when informed it didn't belong to him after all.

His friend Joseph Hopkinson, the son of New Jersey signer Francis Hopkinson, said of him, "His predominant passion was to promote every scheme for the improvement of his country."

His dearest wish, he once said, was for his country to become independent.

One fine thing was said of him: he was never heard to speak ill of anyone.
